Brazil, officially the Federative Republic of Brazil, is the largest country in South America and in Latin America. The capital of Brazil is Brasília.

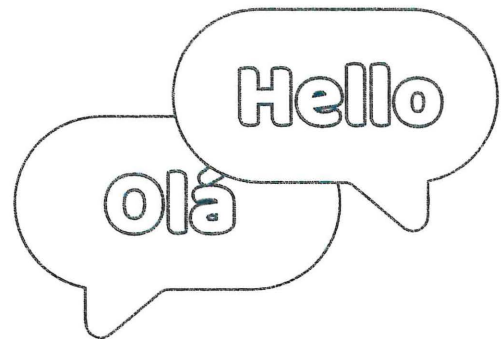
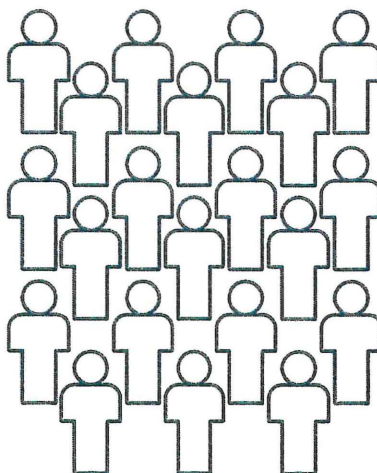


Brazil is the world's fifth-largest country by land area at 3.288 million square miles (8.5 million square kilometers).

With over 217 million people, the country is the seventh most populous worldwide.



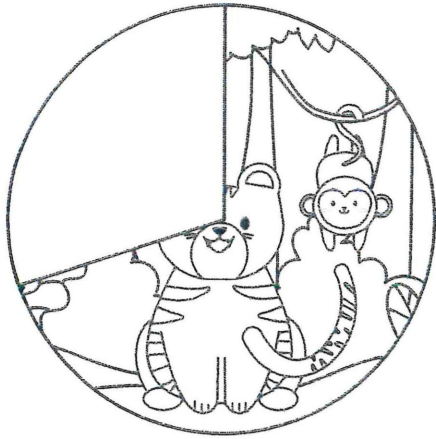
As a former Portuguese colony, the official language of Brazil is Portuguese.

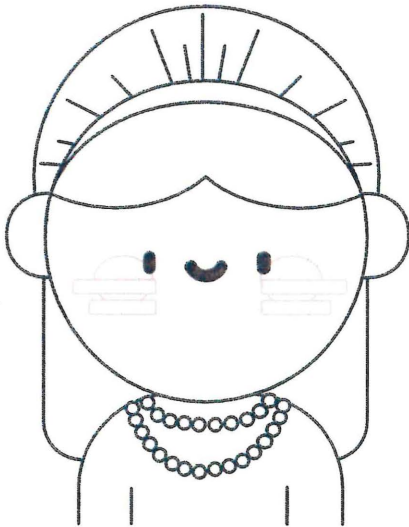
At least 103,870 animal species and 43,020 plant species are currently known, 70% of the world's cataloged



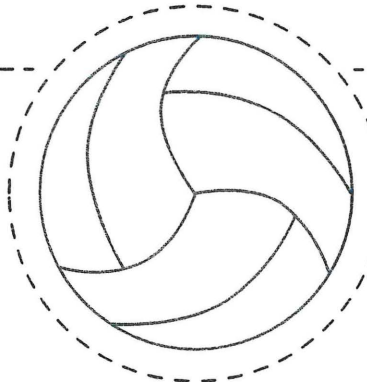
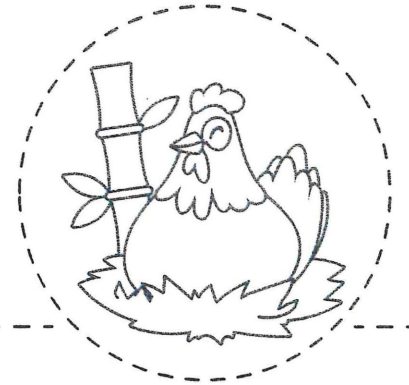
With a vibrant culture, Brazil's carnival in Rio de Janeiro is the world's largest carnival, with two million people wearing elaborate costumes daily on the streets.



There are 896,917 Indigenous people in Brazil, distributed among 305 ethnic groups.

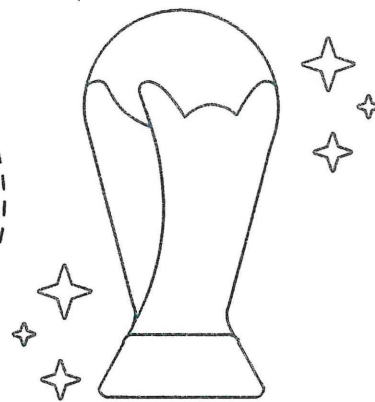
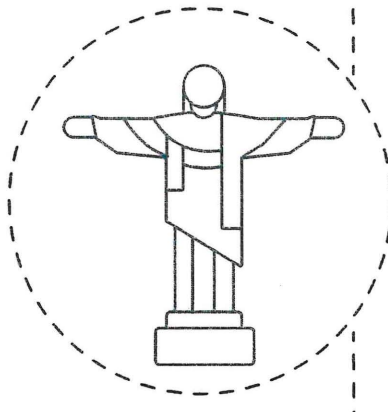


In 2020, Brazil became the world's largest exporter of chicken and sugarcane; approximately 10 million hectares are used for sugarcane plantations in Brazil.



After football, volleyball is Brazil's second most popular sport.

With a rich culture and history, Brazil has 22 UNESCO world heritage sites, including Iguazu National Park, and Christ the Redeemer statue, one of the new seven wonders of the world.



As of 2023, Brazil has won more FIFA World Cup titles than any other country, with five titles.
